

Admission Criteria

- The patient has a terminal illness with a prognosis of six months or less.
- The patient has an attending physician who validates that the patient has six months or less to live if the disease follows its normal progresssion.
- The patient or legal guardian chooses care focusing on comfort and support.
- The patient, hospice and facility agree to the admission.
- The care facility has a contractual agreement with hospice.

Medical Indicators For Hospice Evaluation

Your resident may be appropriate for a hospice evaluation if any of the following symptoms were experienced in the past six months:

- Weight loss of 10% or greater
- Decreased or minimal appetite
- Requires significant daily assistance
- Increased in need for oxygen
- Multiple hospitalizations

- Change in level of consciousness
- Increase in treatment or therapies
- More isolated, withdrawn or restless
- Skin Breakdown
- Decreased ambulatory ability

End Stage Renal Disease

- Chronic / acute illness that precipitated renal failure
- Discontinuing or refusing dialysis
- Not tolerating a sufficient amount of fluid or nutrition to sustain life
- Abnormal lab values (i.e. elevated BUN and creatinine)

End Stage Liver Disease

- Jaundice
- Ascites
- Edema
- Anorexia
- Abnormal lab values (i.e. liver enzymes or elevated pro-time)

End Stage Dementia

- · Bed bound or unable to ambulate
- Dependent on ADLs
- Incontinence
- Difficulty swallowing or refusing to eat
- · Food intake insufficient to sustain life
- Refusing G-tube placement
- 10% weight loss over the past six months
- Minimal Vocabulary

End Stage Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

- Difficulty breather at rest (Dyspnea)
- Oxygen dependency
- · Rapid heart rate when resting
- 10% weight loss
- Frequent ER visits / hospitalizations
- Abnormal lab values on basic metabolic profile

End Stage Cardiovascular Disease

- 10% weight loss over the past six months
- Insufficient fluid or caloric intake to sustain life
- Dependent on ADLs
- Bed / chair bound

End Stage Cardiac Disease

- Requires considerable assistance with ADLs and frequent medical support
- Difficulty breathing at rest (Dyspnea)

Cancer

- Anorexia with significant weight loss
- Need for pain / symptom management with medication adjustments
- Evidence of end-stage disease and/or metastasis
- · No longer receiving curative treatment

Severe Malnutrition

- 10% or more weight loss over the past six months
- Not responding to nutritional support
- Loss of appetite, muscle wasting, refusal to eat
- Karnosfky score < than or equal to 40%
- Body Mass Index < than or equal to 22kg/m2
